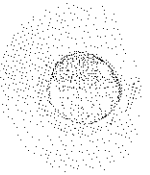
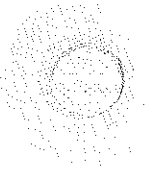


Chapter 5

ANIMALS*

*State law reference—Agriculture and domestic animals, G.S. Title 22.



Sec. 5-1. Reserved.

Editor's note—Section 5-1, pertaining to bounty on certain animals, was deleted at the request of the town. Former § 5-1 derived from an ordinance adopted Oct. 6, 1884.

Sec. 5-2. Allowing dogs on property other than owner's.

(a) No owner or keeper of any dog shall allow such dog to be upon the land of another unless:

- (1) The owner of the land has given the owner or keeper of the dog permission to have the dog so present;
- (2) On public or quasipublic property the dog is properly on a leash of no more than ten (10) feet in length held by the owner or keeper of the dog.

(b) Owners and keepers of dogs shall be responsible for the immediate removal of any feces discharged by said dog when such discharge occurs off the owner's or keeper's property.

(c) Violation of any of the provisions of this section will result in a fine of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for the first offense and fifty dollars (\$50.00) for the second offense.

(d) The provisions of this section shall be enforced by the town animal control officer and the department of police services.
